The cost is \$15 in lieu of the normal \$8 table money. The course includes practice hands and notes on the topics covered.

THIS ITEM IS WORTH REPEATING. (Many of our newer members need to take heed) Since 1st August 2013 the Alerting Rules have been changed by the ABF to include "Announcements". When you open 1Club or a natural 1NT the opener's partner must automatically announce, without waiting to be asked, the essential meaning of the bid. For a 1NT opening the announcement is the strength of the range. So, partner says, "15 to 17" or "16 to 18" or whatever the range is. For a 1 Club opening, it depends on the system. Partner announces the minimum club length guaranteed, saying, "4 plus Clubs" or "3 plus Clubs" etc.
