

A claim should be accompanied at once by a clear statement of the line of play or defence through which the claimer proposes to win the tricks claimed, including the order in which the cards will be played. The player making the claim or concession faces his hand.



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Celebrity Profile. Victor Mollo





In the foreword to "Card Play Technique or the Art of Being Lucky", co-authored by Victor Mollo and Nico Gardener, the two are described as having a "symbiotic relationship". Born within a year of each other in Russia and Latvia respectively, they had an amazing amount in common. They both were polyglots, speaking 10 languages between them, both were Jewish, both fled their home-land and both were married (not at the same time) to the same woman. Victor's marriage to Pat lasted 7 years before an amicable divorce. He found love again with his Jeanne (known as "the Squirrel"), whom he met at the BBC while Pat did the same with Nico

When Nico suffered a heart attack, Victor rushed to his bedside, whereup0n Nico said, "Victor, you smoke more than I do, you eat more than I do, how come / had the heart attack?" A week later, after Victor had his own heart attack, they were convalescing together in Brighton.

Victor Mollo was born in St Petersburg into a rich Russian family. When he was eight, the October Revolution occurred and his family fled Russia, travelling on a train, purchased by his mother for the purpose, with forged Red Cross papers, crossing into Finland, then on to Stockholm, Paris and finally London. There he neglected his studies and devoted himself to bridge. As an editor in the European service of the British Broadcasting Corporation, he began to write books and articles on the game. After his retirement in 1969, he started to write even more extensively, and from then until his death in 1987 he wrote thirty books and hundreds of articles. He was also active in developing bridge cruises, mostly in the Mediterranean.

His lifestyle was unusual. He would play rubber bridge at his club each afternoon, enjoy dinner and wine with his wife ("The Squirrel") and then work all night until 6 am, when he would take a nap. While he occasionally competed successfully in the major duplicate bridge tournaments, winning four national titles, he preferred rubber bridge.

He is best known for his Bridge in the Menagerie series, which started with the book of the same name, first published in 1965. The series featured Hideous Hog, by far the club's best player but also an insufferable shark who seeks to humiliate opponents for their mistakes, Rueful Rabbit, a small timid man who can barely hold his cards together and can't always tell diamonds from hearts, but has such incredible luck that even when the cards he accidentally drops (several at once, occasionally) become the right ones, Molly the Mule, the lone recurring female character, who is always certain she is right and is as stubborn as the proverbial mule.

One of the series is titled "Diamonds are a Hog's Best Friend"

Whilst Victor was married to Pat, she bought a watch from Harrods that never worked. He returned the watch to the store with this note: "This timepiece, throughout its' inglorious career, has rushed forward at a giddy pace and languishley (sic) behind but has always maintained its lofty contempt for time!" Harrods rewarded him with a new watch and a case of wine.
