The Winds of Change

Heraclitus, a Greek philosopher born in 544 b.c. said, "No man ever steps in the same river twice, for it's not the same river and he's not the same man."

And so it is for our Bridge Club.

It is part of the human condition that we embrace the comfort of the familiar and that we tend to resist change.

That is normal and it has ever been thus.

Indeed, many of our members had misgivings at the recent introduction of modern scoring methods using bridge mates.

A significant majority of our members have indicated favorably for the starting time of our sessions to be later than as currently, at 12:00 noon.

Having had due regard to some members' concerns, the <u>STARTING TIME FOR BRIDGE SESSIONS</u> will be 12:30 pm for all sessions. There will be no "Lunch Break" as such, only a 5-10 minute comfort interval. Playing 27 boards, the finishing time will remain unaltered at 3:40 pm. This small change means that a much better use be made, pre-bridge, of the morning. It makes for a shorter session and, also, a more sensible lunch time (before bridge starts) than the 1:30 p.m. currently.

Tuesday sessions, in effect will be 15 minutes later insofar as the lesson will commence at 12:30 pm with actual play starting at 12:45 pm. These changes will take effect beginning of August and the invitation is extended to all our players to embrace the new regime in a positive, constructive and confident manner.
