PRUDENTIAL FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT

Our Club is not in a dire financial position at present. It is the duty of your President and his Committee to ensure that this does not change, to be ever vigilant and to anticipate trends.

The attendance at all of our sessions are significantly down with table numbers some 4-6 down on the week days and more than that on Saturdays. This is expected to continue or get worse.

It is understandable, with members in many cases over 90 years of age, that illness and death will inevitably decrease our playing numbers. We have been witness to many such sad departures in the recent past.

While we have had some well attended beginners' classes, these players, in the main, do not translate into regular weekday attendees due to a number of factors, these having been alluded to on a regular basis in past issues of this publication. Some of our regular players play at other clubs, in preference to Easts!

Saturdays are played at the RSL where the room hire is onerous and we run these sessions at a substantial financial loss. On some occasions, we are obliged to pay for room hire at the RSL for sessions during the week.

I ask members for their understanding and to appreciate measures your Committee may implement to compensate for the erosion of revenue. Not a "fun message" but necessary.

He didn't do it....

The Stayman convention was invented independently by <u>Jack Marx</u> and by Stayman's regular partner <u>George Rapée</u>. It became associated with his name because it was first published in an article written by Stayman, in <u>The Bridge World</u> magazine, June 1945. He also gave his name, spelled backward, to the <u>Namyats</u> convention, which was invented by another regular partner, <u>Victor Mitchell</u>.

Stayman and Rapée, <u>John Crawford</u> and <u>Howard Schenken</u>, <u>Charles Goren</u> and <u>Sidney Silodor</u> won the inaugural <u>Bermuda Bowl</u> in 1950, representing North America in a 3-way tournament with Great Britain and "Europe". For the next several years the event was a long head-to-head match with a European champion that might be Great Britain; Stayman, Rapée, Crawford, and Schenken won the next two in 1951 and 1953 with different teammates. Stayman also won a score of North American titles.


