Infractions at the table

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THE LAWS OF DUPLICATE BRIDGE LAW 45 – CARD PLAYED

A. Play of Card from a Hand

Each player except dummy plays a card by detaching it from his hand and facing* it on the table immediately before him.

*The opening lead is first made face down unless the Regulating Authority directs otherwise

LAW 54 - FACED OPENING LEAD OUT OF TURN

The declarer has five options which include:-

D. Declarer refuses Opening Lead

Declarer may require the defender to retract
his faced lead out of turn. The withdrawn
card becomes a major penalty card and Law
50D applies

LAW 56 DEFENDER'S LEAD OUT OF TURN

When a lead out of turn is faced, declarer may:

- A. Accept the irregular lead as provided in Law 53. or
- B. Require the defender to retract his faced lead out of turn. The withdrawn card becomes a major penalty card and Law 50D applies

Being nice to your partner

A good player, in his sixties, was partnering an old champion (probably about 80), for a weekend tournament. When the tournament was over, the following dialogue took place:-

Champion: "You played very well" Good player: "Oh, thank you"

Champion: "But it's a long time ago"

The Director to a table that is running late: "Please

pull trumps and claim"

Declarer: "But I'm in Notrump"

Director: "Excellent! Just skip to step two".

"I fought the Law ... And the Law won!"

"What is all the fuss about side lines in the game of tennis? I don't care if my ball goes out!"

The game of Bridge, (the same as tennis), is circumscribed by what you can and what you can't do.

Hence "The Laws of Duplicate Bridge".

I hear (and observe) that many players do not bother to follow the rules and the etiquette which are prescribed by the said Laws.

Should this apply to you then please be aware that the normal procedure in the event of an infraction is for the Director to be called and that this is not "being nasty" but rather, an integral part of the game.
