1903-1992 The inventor of the most popular bridge convention in history

EASLEY BLACKWOOD.

His name became a household word because of one of his early inventions, an ace-asking bid that became known as the *Blackwood convention*

In an Interview with Charles Goren he explained, "About 30 years ago I went down in a 7S contract, missing the Ace of trumps. The general Idea is that I want to keep that from happening again!"

"It is important to understand why we learn conventions. They are tools to help us better communicate with partner. But we must become a craftsman and learn to use our tools effectively. Until we do, we will not be able to get the most out of them. The process of learning to use a new convention can be a difficult one. We will often take one step back (make mistakes or have bidding mix-ups) in an effort to move forward. It is important for us to recognize this and realize that adopting a new convention and learning to use it effectively is a long-term investment in improving our game."
