

The **BLUE TEAM** (Italian "Squadra Azzura") represented Italy in international contract bridge tournaments, winning sixteen world titles from 1957 through 1975.

From 1964 to 1969 and during a 1972 comeback, the team comprised three regular pairs: Walter Avarelli -Giorgio Belladonna, Pietro Forquet - Benito Garozzo, and Massimo D'Aleio. - Camillo Pablis Ticci. Eugenio Chiaradia and Guglielmo Siniscalo played in the early years; Dano De Falco, Arturo Franco and Vito Pittala in late years. The spiritual father, long time coach and nonplaying captain, through 1966 was Carl'Alberto Perroux



Did they Cheat? "Under the Table" The Case Against The Blue Team *by* Avon Wilsmore

This book looks at the actions of the Italian Blue Team, whose incredible run of victories include the World Championships of 1957-1959, 1961-1969 and 1972-1975. Throughout that time, there were suspicions as to how these victories were achieved. To what extent were these suspicions justified? The actions of administrators, in response to the problem of cheating over the last 60 years, is discussed in detail. Is it the case that an unofficial policy of "minimize the scandal" in the 1950's and 1960's led to the horrific facts uncovered by Boye Brogeland and others in 2015?

A large part of the Blue Team's success lay in new and innovative bidding systems, which were often deemed quite strange, especially by conservative US circles. Losing teams sometimes even complained that the Italians had an unfair advantage using bids that were partly incomprehensible to Americans

Take heart! Even the fabled Blue Team "made a blue" sometimes. This is hand 37 on the final day of the European Championships in Stockholm, 1956.



A tragic thing happened to poor Siniscalco: he ran from seven spades doubled which Forquet could have made, ending up in seven no-trump, going down six. When South doubled seven spades it gave Forquet a chance to guess the trump position and land the contract. However, Siniscalco thought it correct to bid seven no-trump. The French reeled off 6 Heart tricks for a penalty of 1100 pts
