Nicoleta provides feedback from the 59th **Gold Coast Congress**, which is the largest bridge event in the Southern Hemisphere and second largest in the world.

In total there were over 9,000 tables for the week and there was a great attendance from overseas players.

The event caters for old and young, for beginners, improvers, intermediates, restricted and experienced players.

Nick and Nicoleta played in the **Open Pairs** (matchpoints) and qualified 16th of their field of 114. That got them to the Plate, where they scored average.

They next played in the **Open Teams**, where after battling heroically for three days, their team came 20th from 236 teams. (**Theo and Leigh** also came in the top 50)

Tired, but still keen, they played in the **Butler Swiss Pairs**, a field of 109 tables. Team Nicoleta and Nick came 22nd, sitting EW and Theo with Leigh came 23rd (sitting NS). Also spotted, were a few other Easts players, the **Mullins** and **Judith Rychter**.


Dinner was at a different restaurant each night in company with different sets of friends from interstate and overseas.

HAND OF THE MONTH

This was Board 23 on Monday 10th February. With South as dealer, how do you find your four **Contract?**

- 1. If South opens one $\stackrel{\bullet}{-}$, then North may bid $2\stackrel{\bullet}{-}$ or $3\stackrel{\bullet}{-}$ or even pass. East should then Double, showing a strong hand and a shortage in $\stackrel{\bullet}{-}$. Whatever South bids, West should overcall $\stackrel{\bullet}{-}$ s showing the 5-card suit, and voila, you will find your $4\stackrel{\bullet}{-}$ contract.
- 2. If South passes, (if your system includes muti-2s), then West would bid 2♠ showing a weak hand with 5♠ and 5 of a minor, and East would then bid to 4
- 3. However, if you do not play multi-2s, and if there were 3 passes, East would open 1 . What should West then do? If West bids 2 he would be denying his major (in this case 5). If West responds 1 then East should jump to 3 as an invitation to game and West should bid 4 By the way, if you use "Losing Trick Count" then West has only a 7-loser hand, despite only having 7 high card points.
- 4. Incidentally, less than a third of the field found their 4♠ contract!
