HOLD THAT 'PHONE... The use of telephones during bridge sessions is a gross discourtesy and a grave breach of Bridge Etiquette. Excepting rare instances, where pre-arrangements have been made with the director for medical reasons or such, the mobile phone should be turned to silent or, perhaps, completely off. At the recent Committee Meeting, the issue was raised by the Directors and penalties for persistent offenders are being considered. \$2 fine per ringing phone and \$5 if picked up and answered. Entering data on Bridgemates – Normal procedure is for South to score and East to check. It is best that contract and lead be entered before the game commences. However, if South is the opening lead or dummy, play takes precedence. It is also preferable that the bridgemate is not handed around the whole table for result to be seen, as this is time consuming.
