#### The Next Beginner's Course starts on Tuesday 19th



#### MISTAKES I HAVE MADE

Allen Rosenberg represented Easts Bridge Club in the Metropolitan Finals of the Grand National Open Teams event and, in this and in subsequent Newsletters, shares with us some instructive mistakes.



(Sitting East), my left- hand opponent opens one Club, my partner overcalls Spades, my right-hand opponent bids 4 Clubs, showing strong support in Clubs. I think for a moment, then bid 4 Spades, in the knowledge that going down two or three (with favourable vulnerability), would be a good result. When my left-hand opponent then bid 5 Clubs, followed by two passes, I then bid 5 Spades, knowing that -500 would be a better score than -600.

That was a mistake! my left-hand opponent then bid 6 Clubs, which cannot be beaten, and we scored -1370 on that hand.

#### The mistake – DO NOT BID FIVE OVER FIVE

#### Your editor is mortified!

So many of our players, (some of many years' experience), express surprise that the opening lead should be placed face down and await partner's OK that it is, in fact, the legal lead. Not only does this make sense in preventing "Lead Out of Turn" but it is also the Law.

# THE LAWS OF DUPLICATE BRIDGE Law 41- Commencement of Play Face-down Opening Lead

"After a bid, double or redouble has been followed by three passes in rotation, the defender on presumed declarer's left makes the opening lead face down".
